Since the pandemic, we are all even more aware of the importance of our mental health. All our staff have had access to mental health training and Kay Shaw has now completed training to become our mental health first aider and able to offer support to all our school community. Well done Kay and thank you!

Clubs



Although it seems like the covid restrictions are easing and everything is almost back to normal, schools have had to continue to monitor bubble mixing, cross over of staff and limiting use of rooms across different bubbles and enhanced cleaning of used areas. This means we have not been able to fully offer everything we can 'normally'.

This is what we have done:

- Made 7:30am club available made possible with year group specific ventilated areas,
- Made FREE breakfast club available again made possible with year group specific ventilated areas,
- Offered a FREE Kixx afterschool club to reception, year 1 & year 2 one night per week per year group,
- Offered film club to years 1 & 2 who sit in year group bubbles in the ventilated hall,
- Introduced breakfast, breaktimes and lunch sports groups with Kixx outdoors, again year group specific.

This is what we have not yet been able to offer:

- 4pm/5pm club this is because demand for the club (most likely due to people's working patterns changing) has been almost nil. We have had a couple of parents ask these past few weeks but to make 1 or 2 children from different year groups socially distance from each other and from staff who are not part of their bubble, we felt was difficult and really not that nice. There's also the affordability issue if demand is too low. Hopefully, after half term when more restrictions ease demand for the club may increase and we can hopefully look to restart this. We apologise to those parents who may have needed the club during this time of restrictions.
- Extra Curricular Afterschool Clubs . Normally these are offered across main school with
 different classes and year groups mixing. Bubble restrictions mean we cannot do this
 presently. In the past, even by offering to all main school, places for these clubs often don't
 get filled and we subsidise the cost using school funds. If we offered year group specific
 afterschool clubs then more of school funds would be used in paying for the staff or the
 provider. Until we are able to fully mix children, clubs like these will most likely start in
 September.

We hope that you will agree considering the restrictions we have tried our best to provide as much as possible.

KEEP CLEAR!



Again, we are having numerous complaints by concerned parents that people are parking on the double yellow zig zag lines outside of school. We all know, even if you are not a driver, that you cannot park there! We have sent out text messages politely requesting for it to be stopped but it has continued so we have now contacted the police. The staff carpark should also not be used as a short cut nether, as it is overcrowded, used by deliveries, visitors, taxis and staff working a different times.





Year 1 & 2 welcomed Toby a very special visitor from Just Different this month. Just before his first birthday Toby was diagnosed with cerebral palsy, a condition affecting the ability to control muscles. Toby is unable to talk and uses a speech synthesiser to communicate; he also uses a motorised wheelchair to get around. He lives independently employing full time support assistants to help him with his everyday needs. He joined the class discussions via zoom and below are some of the questions Owls class asked along with his answers!

The class found out Toby likes Skiing (he's actually reached Black Run standard on his sit -ski) so they asked why does Toby like skiing?

He said that he liked skiing because he can go really fast like lightning and he can be free.

They also found out along with his skiing he loves to go on holiday especially to far-flung places so the class wanted to know how does he get on a plane in his wheelchair?

Toby said he has to get the plane early and has help, he has to get on his small wheelchair, which fits down the isle and then he is transported into a normal plane seat like everybody else and then his chair goes into the luggage compartment under the plane.

Miss Drury said the children certainly got a better understanding of how disabilities can effect everyday life but Toby told them that no matter what your disability or ability get out there and try things! You may have to find a different way to do something but if you want it enough you will find a way!
